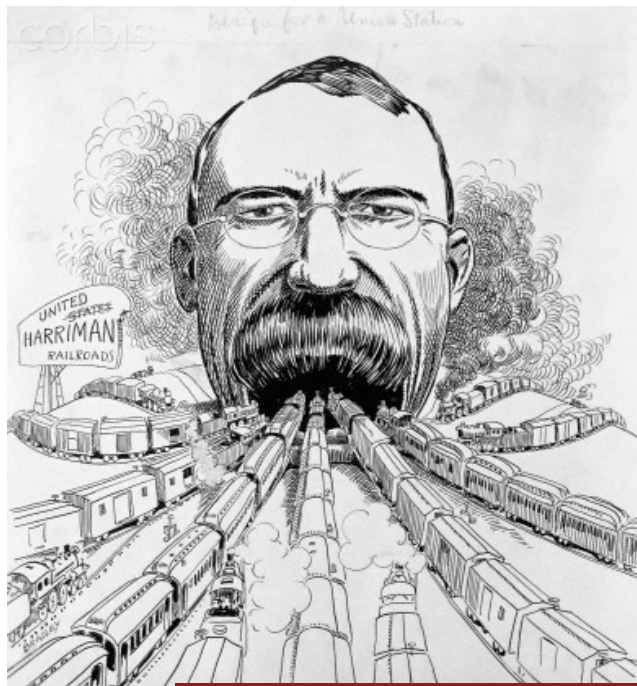

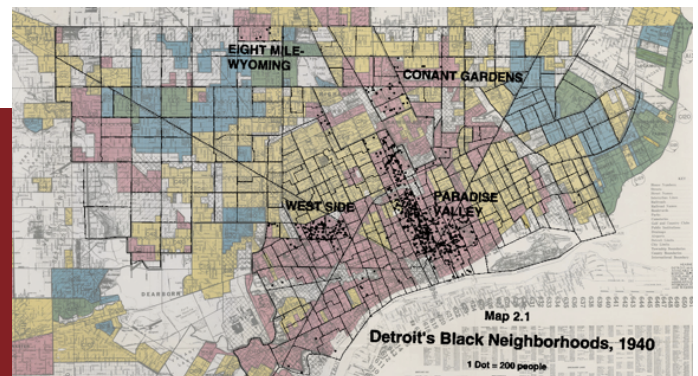

“Redlining” refers to the old banking practice of drawing red lines around areas where specific ethnic or racial groups were allowed to live . . . or could not live. “Redlining” referred to charging more (or refusing) to provide financial services, insurances, etc. to specific groups. The term “digital redlining” refers to forms of discrimination based on data that indirectly identify people on the basis of ethnicity, gender, race, and other such categories. Thus, digital redlining refers to digital profiling that produces discriminatory practices. These profiles are collected from school databases, credit cards, web surfing, etc. It’s based on digital surveillance. KEY POINT: the old forms of surveillance relied on knowing that you were being watched, but now, digital redlining operates invisibly. It creates an environment of limited choices and hidden alternatives.
